Dear Parents,

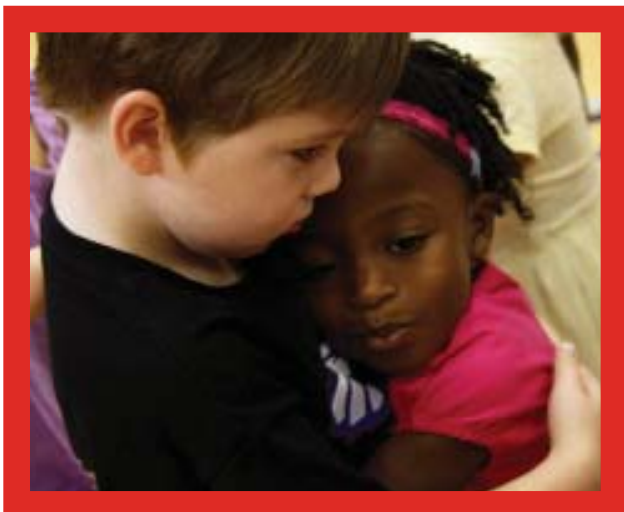

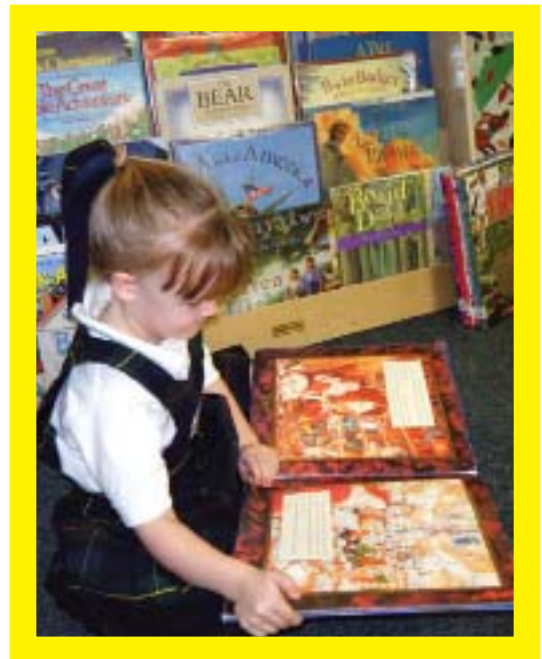

Preschool Curriculum

Our children experience the adventure of learning and the joy of success through our hands on curriculum. Everyday Math and Handwriting Without Tears are award winning examples of preschool curriculum. Motivating early learners is achieved with an "I Can Do This" attitude, along with materials and literature that work together to inspire and encourage academic success. Learning Centers include Math, Science, Fine Arts, Technology, Early Literacy, Oral Language, Social Studies and Social Development as well as an introduction to Spanish. Each preschool class participates in faith lessons and weekly chapel time. Children enjoy weekly specials that include Technology, Library and Letter Detectives. Music, offered twice each week, provides experiences in rhythm, marching, simple instruments and singing. Physical Education is offered through our Creative Movement class. We warm up those little muscles as children work on large motor control and hand-eye coordination. Each child is given the opportunity to shine individually through POP Star and class leader days.

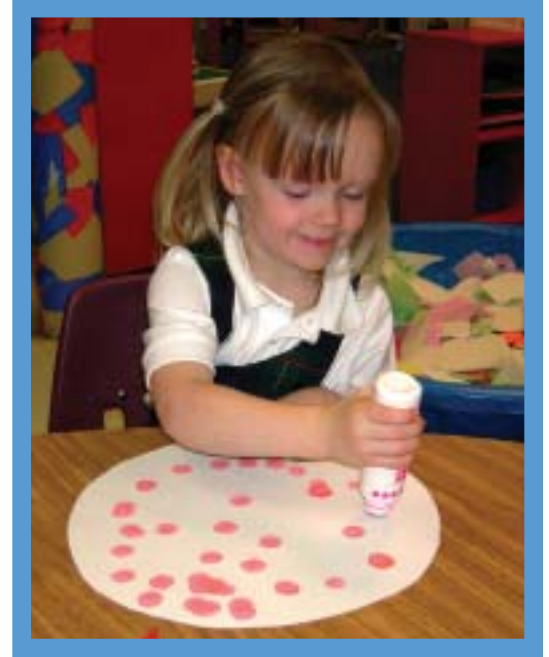
All children travel through developmental stages and we know that God has a time table for each child. Through the Learning Center approach, the uniqueness of each child is allowed to thrive in an environment that will challenge all children.



PRESCHOOL AT A GLANCE...

“Jesus’ love is like a circle. It is round and never ends.” “Blue, blue, Jesus loves you.” “F” is for firefighter, family, and fun friends.” Here at Prince of Peace, preschool is a place where our children learn and grow through experience and creative, hands-on learning. Our curriculum includes literature, math, science, Jesus time and much more. These are incorporated through interactive centers within our classrooms, through group lessons and activities led by our teachers, and through extra special thematic days during our school year. The POP preschool experience includes special shape days, color days, and letter days, all designed to increase preschoolers’ knowledge of these concepts, as well as add an extra special touch and excitement to our curriculum.

Shape days in preschool are super fun! Our teachers are transformed into Shape Super Heroes, making shapes more memorable for our little ones. Circles, squares, triangles and many more are brought to life by exciting super heroes who make shapes super fun and easy to remember!



Color days in preschool are just that... colorful! Preschoolers leave their uniforms at home on these days, wear the color of the day, and anxiously await the visit of the Color Fairy! With the help and creativity of the Color Fairies, preschoolers learn to identify each color, while incorporating memorable activities all about each color.

Letter Detectives is a distinctive part of each week which helps preschoolers identify letters and their sounds. This letter time allows preschoolers to experience each letter in ways that both capture attention and increase ability to remember and identify both upper and lower case characters. Special days are devoted to every letter. Art, science, math, and classroom centers often incorporate the letter of the week and may include special visitors and activities which happen outside the classroom as well.





Centers within our classrooms are both fun and purposeful. At these young ages, a child's work is play! Children are able to incorporate the use of many skills while having fun during center time. Blocks and home centers, reading and math centers, along with writing and puzzles, not only enhance fine motor and manipulative skills, spatial ability, and creativity. These activities also encourage social skills needed throughout life. At Prince of Peace, preschoolers learn how to be friends, while learning about their friend, Jesus.



Early Literacy is embedded in all areas of our program. Writing centers, word walls, and letter detectives take place daily. Every one of us loves a good story and story teller. Library time is a great introduction to the school library, including how to be respectful of the books, using inside voices so that everyone can enjoy the story and discovering how to pull a book to look at and then, how to remember where it goes when we want to put it back. Our librarian entertains and delights our preschool children on a weekly basis. Parents have the opportunity to go to the library with their child and check out books, as well as participate in the twice yearly book fairs.





Making a Joyful NoiseThe Lord says.... make a joyful sound. Preschool children at Prince of Peace do make a joyful sound in music. Is it always musical? Well, maybe not, but lots of laughter and giggles will accompany the musical games, rhythm instruments, drum beats and sound vibrations. This all adds up to a wonderful appreciation for music. The preschool children perform on the BIG stage in our Fine Arts building three times a year: Grandparents' Day, Christmas and our "end of the year" program. There is nothing more precious than to see children excited to perform for you! Each classroom enjoys music twice weekly.

Preschool children in a **computer** lab? Yes, once a week the 4 year old classes go to the elementary lab. The Preschool children learn computer basics, mouse control and are introduced to many fun learning games that are then installed and used on our classroom computers.



Hola, buenos dias, Senora! Preschoolers are learning **Spanish** and loving it! Senora visits the 4 year old classes once a week. Children are introduced to Spanish as they work on our names, greetings, colors, shapes, and numbers.

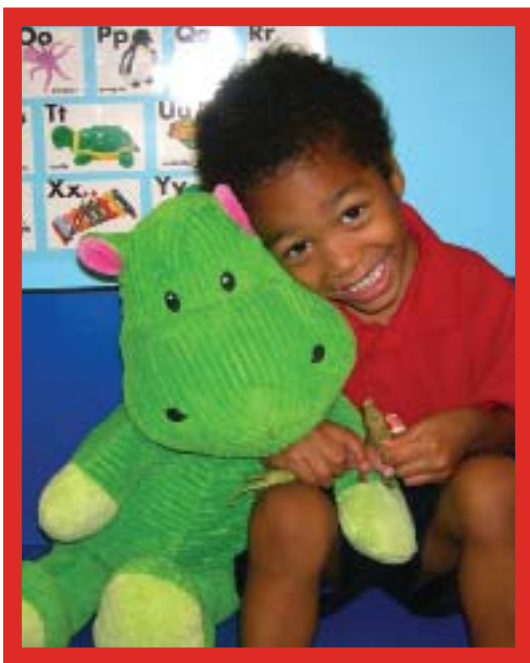

The large art pieces that you see hanging in the preschool hallway, as well as the ones on the wall in our indoor play area, were completed during two different **“ART NIGHT”** events. “POP’N UP”! Our 4 year olds **“POP UP”** to Kindergarten! This is a day when our 4 year old classes visit one of our Kindergarten classrooms. They spend 30-40 minutes with the Kindergarten teachers who present a special learning activity to the children. This gives our preschool students a “taste of Kindergarten” and a chance to interact with their prospective teachers. It’s a pretty big deal to sit in those kindergarten chairs! The Kindergarteners really enjoy being our **“Kindergarten Buddies”** and sharing their teachers and classrooms with us! The 4 year olds also have a snack day of friendship fruit salad and an afternoon of kite making with their **“Kindergarten Buddies”**.



CHAPEL Our children attend chapel on Wednesdays every week. It is a time of celebration and coming together to praise our Lord Jesus Christ and to learn basic Bible principles. It is quite engaging and interactive for the children. Our goal is to help the children understand the greatness of our God that they may grow in a personal relationship with Him. We have fun in worship. As a large group we celebrate birthdays and pray for each other and our community.



As children loved by God, we want our children to also love others. Because of this, we teach them to love their families, classmates, teachers, and those that they don't even know. We have taken on some mission projects that extend God's love from our world here at Prince of Peace to others in countries far away. We have collected and continue to collect money to send to **"Water to Thrive"** to build wells and filtration systems in Africa to give the people there clean water to drink. The children were shown "dirty" water, and with that illustration it was explained to them that they could make a difference with their offerings. With the children's offerings some wells have been dug and the people living there now have clean water! The children have seen a tape of when the first water was pumped from one of the wells. Language and Early Literacy Development

Experiencing Children's Literature

The Child:

- * Listens with increased attention.
- * Listens and engages in exchanges about literature.
- * Listens for a different purpose.
- * Demonstrates a literal meaning of story.
- * Draws pictures based on a story.
- * Begins to differentiate between reality and fantasy.
- * Begins to retell sequences of events in stories.

Speech

The Child:

- * Produces speech with increasing ease and accuracy.
- * Perceives differences between similar sounding words (e.g. goat-coat)
- * Experiments with new language sounds.
- * Attempts to engage in role-playing.

Vocabulary/Verbal Expression

The Child:

- * Shows a steady increase in listening and speaking vocabulary.
- * Links new learning experiences and vocabulary.
- * Uses new vocabulary in communication.
- * Uses sentences of increasing length in everyday speech.
- * Refers to self in first person.
- * Dictates a story.
- * Demonstrates the use of language to retell stories or events.
- * Knows pictures (icons) go with certain labels (words).
- * Dictates a caption for drawing.
- * Begins to interpret pictures orally.
- * Asks questions and makes comments related to the current topic.
- * Gives simple directions.

Phonological Awareness "Early Word Recognition"

The Child:

- * Demonstrates increased awareness of letter sounds and can make sound matches.
- * Begins to break words into syllables by clapping.
- * Listens and recites familiar poems, chants, and songs with ease.
- * Identifies rhymes and rhyming sounds. Participates in rhyming games.
- * Develops letter recognition skills through words in the environment.
- * Associates the names of letters with their shapes.
- * Matches upper and lower cases of the same letter.
- * Begins to make some letter and sound matches.
- * Begins to identify high frequency words.
- * Begins to predict what will happen next in stories.

Written Expression

The Child:

- * Understands that writing is used to communicate ideas.
- * Attempts to connect sounds in a word with letter forms.
- * Has opportunities to use writing materials on a daily basis.
- * Begins to dictate words and phrases to an adult for recording.
- * Prints name.
- * Prints random letters.
- * Attempts to write notes, lists, and messages as a form of play.

Mathematics

Numbers

The Child:

- * Participates in activities that relate to number sequencing and counting.
- * Counts concrete objects to ten or higher.
- * Can describe the concept of zero.
- * Begins to compare objects using language such as same, more than, less than, etc.
- * Recognizes how many are in a group without counting.
- * Combines, separates, and names, "how many".
- * Begins to identify first and last in a series.
- * Identifies use of numbers in environment.

Patterns

The Child:

- * Imitates patterns of sounds and physical movements (e.g., clap, stomp, clap, stomp)
- * Recognizes patterns in the environment.
- * Recognizes and reproduces simple patterns of concrete objects.
- * Repeats AB patterns.

Geometric Shapes

The Child:

- * Recognizes, describes, and names shapes.
- * Begins to investigate and predict the results of putting together two or more shapes.
- * Puts together puzzles of increasing complexity.

Measurement/Data/Classification

The Child:

- * Participates in measuring activities.
- * Makes size comparisons (e.g., taller than, smaller than).
- * Uses tools to imitate measuring.
- * Begins to estimate and compare.
- * Uses scale, begins to understand weight (e.g. heavy, light).
- * Collects data by counting.
- * Begins to understand tally charts.
- * Helps conduct simple surveys.
- * Sorts objects into groups.
- * Sorts and classifies material in more than one way.
- * Sequences objects.

Time/Money

The Child:

- * Recognizes and names coins.
- * Begins to understand the concept of money.
- * Begins to categorizes time intervals (e.g. in the morning after snack).
- * Uses terms such as before, after, yesterday, tomorrow, morning, etc.
- * Correctly uses and understands the present, past, and future tenses of verbs.

Preschool Scope and Sequence

Science

Science Processes

The Child:

- * Begins to perform simple investigations.
- * Shows interest in investigating unfamiliar objects, organisms, and phenomena.
- * Uses one or more senses to observe and learn.
- * Compares objects and organisms: Identifies similarities and differences.
- * Explores materials with simple equipment (e.g. pouring, spooning).
- * Begins to offer explanations using his/her own words.
- * Describes observations.
- * Shares observations and findings with others through discussions or pictures.
- * Predicts what will happen next.
- * Uses patterns (such as growth) to predict what will happen next.
- * Participates in creating and using simple charts.

Life/Physical and Earth Sciences

The Child:

- * Groups organisms and objects as living or non-living.
- * Recognizes that living things have needs: water, food, air.
- * Demonstrates a beginning awareness of life cycles.
- * Identifies animals and plants as living things.
- * Investigates and describes state of matter (solid, liquids, or gas).
- * Observes and describes properties of rock, soil, and water.

Technology Applications

The Child:

- * Starts, uses, and exits software programs.
- * Uses a variety of devices such as mouse, touch screen, keyboard.
- * Follows basic oral cues.
- * Uses a variety of software packages with audio, video, and graphics.

Social Studies

Culture/Cummunity

The Child:

- * Gives personal information such as name, age.
- * Begins to learn address/phone number.
- * Names jobs, classmates, personnel, etc.

Fine Arts

Art

The Child:

- * Uses different colors, textures, and shapes to create meaning.
- * Uses a variety of materials (clay, paint, crayons).
- * Begins to use area as a form of self-expression.
- * Shares ideas about artwork.
- * Becomes aware of great artists.
- * Shows interest in experimenting with color.

Music

The Child:

- * Participates in classroom music activities.
- * Begins to sing a variety of songs.
- * Begins to play classroom instruments.
- * Begins to distinguish among the sounds of common instruments.
- * Responds to various tempos through movement.
- * Becomes aware of great composers.
- * Begins to follow a beat.

Social Development

The Child:

- * Begins to be responsible for behavior and actions.
- * Develops a sense of personal space.
- * Expresses interests in self-direction in learning.
- * Demonstrates confidence in self.
- * Adheres to reasonable classroom rules.
- * Shows an awareness of respect/feeling for others.
- * Responds to suggestions from others.
- * Participates in large and small group activities.
- * Shares equipment/materials.
- * Cooperates with others in groups.

Gross/Fine Motor Development

The Child:

- * Demonstrates a sense of balance.
- * Throws/kicks objects in particular direction.
- * Demonstrates ability to catch bean bag/ball.
- * Develops skill to bounce and catch.
- * Coordinates arms/legs (swinging).
- * Pincher skillis more in control.
- * Demonstrates ability to master self-help skills (e.g. zipping/buttoning).
- * Traces, then draws independently.
- * Outlines shapes and irregular figures.
- * Scissor use becomes more developed.

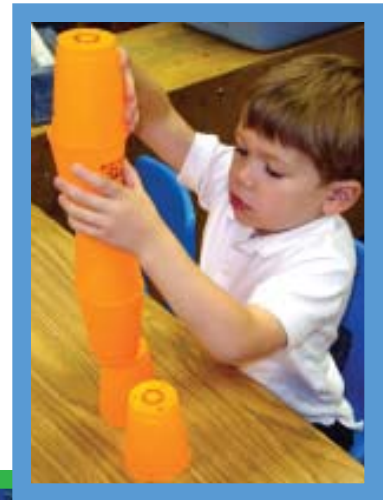

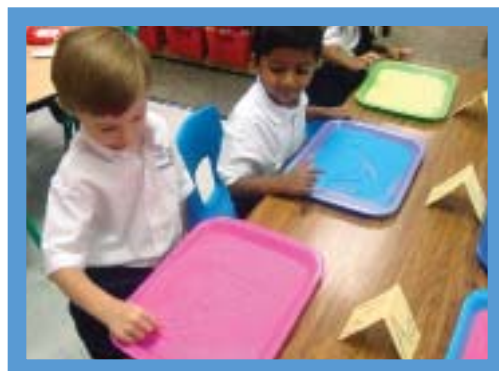

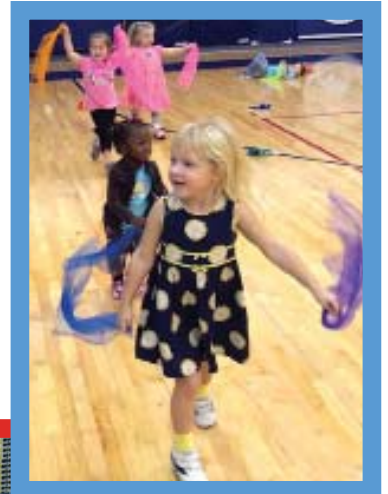
